Why support Press Freedom?



Drawing by Flora Mae A. Lupogan, whose father Lindo, was one of 32 journalists killed in the Ampatuan Massacre in the Philippines in 2009. The Massacre, which took place on November 23rd 2009, is considered to be the single worst attack against journalists in recent years. A total of 57 people were killed in the ambush attack.

n the past year, more than 100 media workers worldwide have died while doing their jobs, victims of either accidents or targeted killings. In our own Asia-Pacific region, 32 colleagues have paid the ultimate price.

The money raised from the annual Press Freedom Media Dinner supports the work of the Media Safety and Solidarity Fund (MSSF) which aids our journalist colleagues in the region in times of emergency, war and hardship.

The good work of this fund can be seen across the Asia Pacific. In the Philippines, MSSF assistance has been provided to the families of journalists killed, enabling their children to receive a full year of education. The number of children supported by the program in that country alone has reached 47.

In Nepal, the MSSF supports a long-term program to fund the education of

all children of killed journalists through to adulthood. The fund now supports more than 75 children of media workers killed during the 10-year insurgency and in the instability that has followed the King's 2006 abdication.

The fund also supports a project in China which monitors and reports on violations against journalists and media rights. The initiative produces a monthly news bulletin which notifies a network of China press freedom advocates and journalists of relevant incidents and government crackdowns.

In Pakistan, the MSSF has allocated funds to support journalists and their families who lost their homes and livelihoods in the 2010 floods.

These are just some examples of how the money raised at our annual Press Freedom Media Dinner supports journalists as they continue to work for media freedom and democracy.
