Who should attend?

In-house training

- The training is available on an in-house basis to law firms and governments departments (including interstate) and Australian Bar Associations.

Course Structure

- The course is divided into two parts. Part 1 is the first five days of the course and provides participants with the requisite number of training hours to meet the requirements of the NMAS. However, to become accredited under the NMAS participants must complete an accreditation day which is Part 2 of the course – day six.
- Participants have the option of doing Part 1, the first five days of the course, and completing Part 2, the last day, at another time or with another RMAB. However, by completing Part 2 successful participants will be eligible for RMAB accreditation.
