Christine Kaufmann is Professor of International, Constitutional and Administrative Law at the University of Zurich. She has worked for the Swiss Central Bank, during which time she served as a member of the EFTA expert groups on financial services and free movement of capital and services and represented the Swiss Central Bank in the negotiations on the European Economic Area. She has also served as Director of Legal Research at the World Trade Institute (WTI) in Bern, where she is now a senior research fellow and a member of the board.

Professor Kaufmann leads the University of Zurich Competence Center for Human Rights (UZHR), part of the Swiss Centre of Expertise in Human Rights. The UZHR is responsible for the Cluster Human Rights and Business in the Swiss Centre, and it focuses in particular on the integration of human rights standards in economic activities of both public and private actors.
