Advanced Trial Advocacy Course



The Australian Bar Association's Third Residential Advanced Trial Advocacy Course is being held in Sydney from 19-23 January 2009. This is a course run by the profession for the profession.

At least two year's experience at the independent Bar is a pre-requisite. More is beneficial.

The course is particularly suited to senior juniors who wish to hone their skills with the benefit of comments from coaches who include Supreme Court justices, Australian and International Senior Counsel and expert performance coaches.

A Federal Court brief is provided for preparation. Performances by the barristers are video-recorded and analysed in small group and one-on-one coaching sessions.

The emphasis is on developing each advocate's strengths in addressing, examining in chief and cross-examining.
