Jay Leno first stop on Silverchair tour

SILVERCHAIR will start their latest assault on the US with a performance on The Tonight Show With Jay Leno on Tuesday.

Despite enjoying success in the US in the late 90s, it will be the first time the band has appeared on the TV show. The group will perform its hit single, Straight Lines, ahead of the release of the latest album, Young Modern, in the US on July 24.

The single is being played by at least 30 major radio stations across the US.

In another publicity coup, Silverchair will perform on CBS's Late Late Show with Craig Ferguson, while frontman Daniel Johns has filmed a major feature for MTV News.

Silverchair kicks off a US tour this week, starting in San Diego on Friday and wrapping up in Minneapolis on August 5.

The band then heads off to Europe for a three-week tour.

In Australia, Silverchair's latest single, Reflections Of A

Sound, will be released next Saturday and the band will then take to the road for the Across The Great Divide Tour with Powderfinger, with tickets on sale tomorrow.

The Australian tour starts in Newcastle on August 29.
