The Attorney-General invites expressions of interest, or nominations of suitable persons, for appointment as Federal Magistrates in Adelaide, Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne and Sydney.

The Federal Magistrates Court deals with a wide range of less complex federal civil matters including family law and child support, migration, administrative law, bankruptcy, unlawful discrimination, workplace relations, consumer protection, privacy and copyright.

Successful appointees will have high-level legal expertise, particularly in family law or general federal law, and must have been enrolled as a legal practitioner for at least five years.

The salary for a federal magistrate is \$249,490 per annum. Other terms and conditions include superannuation, use of a privately-plated Commonwealth motor vehicle, 4 weeks annual recreation leave, and provision for leave purchase.
