

## Alan Stredwick Lloyd

Alan Stredwick Lloyd came from a legal background. He was associate to Justice Sly and was admitted to the New South Wales Bar on 11 May 1914. He volunteered but was rejected for overseas service on medical grounds. He became an intelligence officer at prisoners of war camps in Australia.

Lloyd was appointed to act as a District Court judge at different periods from 1931 to 1938 and became president of courts martial in Eastern Command, then deputy judge advocate general and later the director of the Army Legal Service (1943–46) with the rank of brigadier. He took silk in 1946 and was permanently appointed District Court judge and chairman of Quarter Sessions in February 1954. From 1948 to 1958 he was appointed to act as a judge of the Supreme Court on several occasions
