

George Munro Edwards

George Edwards enlisted on 11 August 1914. He embarked aboard the *Berrima* on 19 August 1914. He served with the Australian Naval and Military Expedition Force (AN & MEF) until March 1915 in New Guinea. After completing his law course in March 1917, Edwards entered the NSW Aviation School at Richmond, gaining a pilot's certificate on 26 January 1918. He sailed for Egypt on 2 March 1918 and joined the RAF as a cadet in April. Promoted to second-lieutenant (flying officer) on 19 September 1918, he returned to Australia after demobilisation.

Edwards became associate to Justice Ferguson. He was admitted to the New South Wales Bar on 16 March 1917, then Removed from Roll of Barristers on 7 June 1922 at his own request and admitted as a solicitor.

His brother Colin also enlisted, in the 55th Battalion and survived the war. Another brother, William James Munro Edwards was killed in action with the 1st Light Horse at Beersheba in Palestine in 1917.
