#### Bar Practice Course 1/24 (May) and 2/24 (August/September)

The Bar Practice Course is held bi annually, in May and September. Following the Bar Practice Course, readers will be required to undertake additional professional development activities as part of their readership.

#### Work restrictions on Readers during the BPC

It is a condition of all readers' practising certificates that they do not practise during the Bar Practice Course period.

#### Assessment

1. As per the Bar Practice Course Policy, satisfactory completion of the course includes punctual attendance at every session of this timetable unless exempted or excused by prior arrangement. Late/unapproved non-attendance will be regarded as poor performance in the overall assessment. Medical certificates will be required for absence due to illness.

2. Instructors will assess performance on an ongoing basis and according to guidelines provided by the Professional Standards and Support Department. Assessment results will be communicated to the reader by the Professional Standards and Support Department.

3. Please refer to the Bar Practice Course Policy for further details on completion requirements.
