Spot is an online tool which allows those who have experienced or witnessed discrimination, workplace bullying and sexual harassment at the New South Wales Bar to make a confidential record or anonymously report the behaviour to an independent Sexual Harassment Officer. http://talktospot.com/nswbar

Any person may make a complaint about the conduct of a judicial officer to the **Judicial Commission of NSW.** The Commission has published an Information Guide about the process, which is available here. Judicial bullying is also addressed in the judicial handbook here.

Anyone can anonymously report sexual harassment by a lawyer to the Office of the Legal Services Commissioner if they have been subjected to, witnessed or have knowledge of the harassment. See here for information from the OLSC.

Reports can also be made via ELKER, a secure online platform that facilitates reports of inappropriate conduct by victims and witnesses.
